### Our 2024 theme...

#### Europe's Parks and Protected Areas are essential partners to bring policy decisions to life!

Protected Areas are builders of bridges. These special places are able to connect international policy decisions and agreements with local communities. Furthermore, they are essential not just for the successful execution of these policies, but also to help shape wide-spread acceptance amongst citizens.

From conserving species, to safeguarding a healthy environment, we called upon our network to showcase all that Europe's Protected Areas are doing to bring policy decisions to life!

# Our promotion...

To help make this European Day of Parks (EDoP) a success, EUROPARC created the official banner in 21 European languages. Furthermore, we provided a <u>social media pack</u> with 17 key messages, 10 images and links to multiple case studies and policy papers to highlight the essential work of Europe's Protected Areas.

To top it off, we created a promotional video in 9 different languages and widely distributed this across social media.

+5,200 Registered views of the EDoP page on the EUROPARC website


# 196 events were <u>registered on our website</u>, across 20 different countries!

Many more local events took place and were registered with our national partners. In total, 100s of events were organised across Europe to celebrate the 2024 European Day of Parks.

## Dutch National Parks open their 'doors' for EDoP 2024

With over 40 events organised in the Netherlands, the 21 Dutch National Parks invited people to enjoy all they have to offer on and around the 24th of May. Under the theme, they focussed on finding the balance between men and nature and the importance of giving back to nature: from hiking and biking excursions, to foraging through mudflats, there was an EDoP activity for everyone.





# Spanish Parks unite to celebrate the European Day of Parks

200 activities were organised in Spain to motivate people to 'Vote for Nature'! A wide variety took place in all the autonomous communities, from hikes and interpretative visits, to conferences and environmental awareness activities, as well as family workshops on different themes and games in nature. In addition, EUROPARC-Spain developed an institutional manifesto in favour of Protected Areas and their fundamental role in conservation and the welfare of people. # 141 German National Landscapes invite visitors to protect and appreciate them

Thanks to the support of our German Section Nationale Naturlandschaften e.V. and the German Association of Nature Parks (VDN Verband Deutsche Naturparke), EDoP was celebrated widely in Germany! From the long weekend of Nature Parks in North Rhine-Westphalia, to hiking days and cultural activities organised by VDN members: 58 events organised in German Protected Areas showcased just how important these natural spaces are and why we should vote to protect them.





#### Italian Parks go all out for EDoP 2024

With 104 events registered on the website of the <u>Italian</u> <u>European Day of Parks</u>, this year's edition was once again a success. There were events focussed on outdoor sport activities, educational events aimed at school children, as well as on site visits to Natura 2000 sites to demonstrate how European nature policies are implemented on the ground.

# Celebrating cross border cooperation at Podyjí & Thayatal National Parks

Bringing policy decision to life means we cannot stop nature conservation at borders! EUROPARC's Transboundary Parks Podyjí & Thayatal National Parks know this like no other. That is why, to celebrate EDoP 2024, they commemorated the 150th anniversary of the Thayabrücke Hardegg border bridge that connects the Austrian and Czech Park with a large, cross-border family festival.





#### Over 300 children get involved in Portugal

In the Alvão Natural Park, the Portuguese Institute for the Conservation of Nature and Forest organised six sessions that involved over 300 school children. The events raised awareness of the importance of Protected Areas and safeguarding the species they are home to. The children watched a documentary, listened to the tale of the 'Red Queen and Blue Butterfly' and got to identify trees based on their leaves.

#### Unite for nature in Ukraine

The Dnister Regional Landscape Park in Ukraine invited visitors of different ages and backgrounds to come and learn about all that lives in the Park. During a special excursion, which focussed on natural habitats, stories of the different plants and animals living in the Park were shared.





#### Students guide visitors through Hamra National Park, Sweden

The European Day of Parks celebrates the creation of Europe's first nine National Parks in Sweden in 1909. Hamra National Park was one of these 'original nine'. This year, to celebrate EDoP, students from a local school guided visitors through the Park. A great way to connect the youngest generation, to the oldest National Park!

#### Maintenance hike in Greece

EUROPARC member Obligatory Cooperative for Managing the Indivisible Forest of Koupa invited community members on a 2,5 hour guided walk to showcase the uniqueness of the forest that deserves protecting. During the hike, participants undertook maintenance of the trail, gaining some hands-on experience to learn what it means to manage protected spaces!







#### Events for kids at the Žemaitija National Park, Lithuania

Multiple events were organised by the National Park. Students in grades 4-10 sent motivational messages to answer the question: "Why do we need Protected Areas?". An orienteering competition "Natura Orient 2024" took place: participants had to orientate themselves in nature by visiting certain points, answer questions about Natura 2000 sites and return to the finish line as quickly as possible.

Social media was buzzing with posts surrounding the European Day of Parks! Many organisations created original content to digitally celebrate and put Parks and Protected Areas in the spotlight. EUROPARC was tagged in over 170 posts across Facebook, Instagram, X and LinkedIn.









The EUROPARC Network also created creative content to celebrate the European Day of Parks and highlight just how important our Parks and Protected Areas are for a well-functioning society.



Parks and Wildlife Finland asked followers to guess what Park was represented by the emojis. On Instagram and Facebook, the post together reached over 30,000 people and gained over 1,000 likes!



The National Parks of Montenegro called people to vote for nature with multiple videos of politicians, ambassadors and people in the public eye underlining the importance of Parks and Protected Areas.



The 16 National Parks of Spain together created a video showcasing their rich diversity, the precious ecosystems they protect, and the pressures they face. Their message is clear: take care of that which takes care of you.

The European Day of Parks is the most important awareness raising event for Protected Areas in Europe. Taking place annually on 24th May, the multiplier effect of all events organised, as well as the outreach on (social) media, ensures that the importance of Protected Areas is drawn to the attention of a large audience.
